No injuries in Rte. 9 vehicle fire

Haddam Volunteer Fire Company responded to a vehicle fire on Monday, Nov. 5, on Route 9S near Exit 8. The vehicle's operator, who reportedly was returning from an antique auction with a loaded van and trailer, heard a popping sound and pulled over realizing that there was a fire in the vehicle's engine compartment.

The operator self-extricated himself from the burning vehicle and attempted to pull items from the van, causing minor burns to his hand. He was treated on scene by Haddam Ambulance personnel and refused additional medical treatment.



Firefighters used a hand line of Engine 6-13 to extinguish the fire. Crews pulled all burning debris from the vehicle and soaked the van's interior and the

van's contents to prevent anything from reigniting.

Firefighters closed both lanes of traffic until the fire was extinguished.

shoes for newborns to adults! They are open the first and third Saturday of each month from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

It was started in 2008 by Laura Kuehn and originally located at the Valley Bible Church in Haddam, and called the "Little Ewe Clothing Closet," which catered to children 10 and under. Laura said, "I

noticed there were many families bringing bags of clothes to church to hand down to others. It seemed that a clothing closet at the church could serve two purposes: (1) as a place for attendees and visitors to exchange kids' clothes, and (2) as an outreach to those in need in the community." In 2016, Valley Bible needed the Closet space and Amy Mainetti helped find a new home for the Closet. The town lets them use the space, and the volunteers are very

grateful for that. At the time of the move, the clothing selection was expanded so that it included older

children, as well as adults. The selection of clothing is varied, from shoes, hats, and gloves, to snow gear for children, and some dress wear. There is no need for financial hardship to browse at the closet. "It can be nice for families to know that as budgets tighten, they do not have to outfit an entire closet for their growing children," said Linda. "Nor do they have to buy a pair of dress pants for a one-time event. We want it to be accessible to all."

It is run by volunteers, and no money is exchanged. They are not, however, an official 501(c) (3). One of the volunteers is Jessica Condil, who is also the Social Services Coordinator for Haddam. She works closely with the Community Closet, and if someone needs access to the closet at another time than when it is normally open, they can contact Jessica. "She has been extremely supportive and encouraging to the work that we do at the Closet," said Laura. "She volunteers her own time to make sure that it stays open."

At this time, they are in need of men's tops of all sizes, larger women's tops (large and extra large), as well as boys' pants in all sizes.



H-K Youth Football: Week 8 highlights

In the final week of the regular season, the A and C squads recorded victories at Canton and Rocky Hill, respectively, and the D squad lost a close game to Canton, also on the road. The B squad had a bye.

The A squad overcame a sluggish first quarter of play and prevailed in a shut out win over the host Canton Warriors by a 30-0 margin. The Cougars defense shut down the Canton passing game and allowed only 99 yards of total offense in the victory.

Despite a fumble recovery by Orion Inkel on the kickoff and an interception by Kevin Harrison in the first quarter, the Cougars were unable to capitalize, turning the ball over on downs and returning possession to the Warriors with an interception. The Warrior offense fared no better. Sacks by Jayden Fulton and a combined effort by Ben Cozean and Aiden Griswold along with a trio of tackles for a loss (Cozean/Bryce Anderson, Cozean/Aiden Griswold, Carey Harwood) disrupted the Warrior offense. In the second quarter the HK offense gained some much needed momentum when Tate Callender energized the HK fans with a 45 yard touchdown run and 20 yard touchdown pass to give the Cougars a 13-0 halftime cushion.

Inkel and Callender controlled the

ground game behind solid offensive line play on HK's first 2 possessions of the second half with Callender adding a pair of scores to his first half tally. Three sacks in a row during Cantons first possession of the second half were recorded by Vincent Scileppi/Aiden Griswold, Aiden Griswold and Carey Harwood.

Rushing leaders on the day were Callender (110 yds), Inkel (41 yds), Carey Harwood (29) and Nick Fox (25). Quarterback Alex Phipps completed 2 of 4 passes to Callender (20 yds) and Anderson (24 yds) and Cavin Napoletano had another solid day kicking 3 of 4 extra point attempts. Owen Lelko and Anderson recorded interceptions and Fulton had a fumble recovery.

Tackle leaders for the game were Vincent Scileppi (3.5), Aiden Griswold (3.5), Owen Lelko (3) and Cozean (3). Also recording multiple tackles on the day were Fulton, Callender, Fox, Harrison, Anderson and Carey Harwood.

The A squad has rebounded from a 1-2 start to the season to record 5 wins in a row and finish with a 6-2 record. The team is the #2 seed in the A playoffs. The undefeated B squad is the #1 seed in the playoffs.

The C squad beat the Rocky Hill Terriers 20-0 to finish the season with a 6-2 record.

The D squad pulled to with 5 points of the Canton Warriors late in the game on a Andrew Soucie touchdown run and extra point run but were unable to score the go ahead touchdown after getting the ball back with a great defensive stand. A Canton touchdown with seconds remaining resulted in an 18-7 final. The D squad finishes the season with a 1-6 record.



Severe Late Stage Asthma in Adults

Severe Asthma is defined as an Asthmatic Condition which requires the use of high-dose inhaled steroids (e.g., Flovent, Advair, Symbicort, QVAR, along with a second controller Ventolin or Pro-air), or systemic oral steroids such as Prednisone, or both. As well, it refers to asthma that remains uncontrolled despite these treatments.

Risk Factors for Late Stage Asthma in Adults:

The adult will usually have other disease processes occurring, such as Severe sinus conditions, Recurrent Respiratory Infections, Fungal Sensitivities, Sleep Apnea, Gastroesophageal Reflux, and Obesity.

According to the American Thoracic Society and European Respiratory Society- Late Onset Severe Asthma is more common in women, than men, and there is less support for genetic factors versus other forms of Asthma.

Characteristics of a Severe Episode of Asthma include:

- Respiratory Rate more than 30breaths per minute,
 Suprasternal Retraction, which means the skin becomes tight between the ribs in the rib cage, and the abdomen is drawn in below the rib cage, also known as belly breathing,
- 3) People are breathless during rest,
- 4) People are not interested in eating,
- 5) People talk in words, not sentences,6) People are usually agitated
- 7) Heart rate is greater than 120 beats per minute
- 8) Breathing occurs in loud bi-phasic (in/out) breaths,

Should you notice these conditions, immediately consult with your physician, as even if you are being treated, the treatment protocol may need enhancement


