Town sustainability event March 6

In September 2018, Haddam registered the town as a "participating community" in Sustainable CT. According to the minutes of the Sept. 10, 2018 Board of Selectmen meeting, "This resolution is an ongoing process looking at recycling, infrastructure, energy savings, within our community [to] help make Connecticut sustainable on many different levels ... Sustainable CT is a comprehensive, statewide, action-oriented voluntary certification program, built by and for municipalities, with the vision that Sustainable CT communities strive to be thriving, resilient, collaborative, and forward looking. They build community and local economy. They equitably promote the health and well-being of current and future residents. And they respect the finite capacity of the natural environment."

The committee hit the ground running. In just a few short months:

the plastic bag recycling initiative which was started in November has been very successful.

The committee is working on getting paint recycling at the Haddam Transfer Station.

the committee started spotlighting different areas of the Haddam Transfer Station to increase recycling.

A compost bin was installed at the Haddam Town Office Building. Another, more centrally located bin, is in the works.

"If we all take a small part, it is much easier," said Kristin Battistoni, committee member and Haddam Tax Collector. She advises that if a company uses packaging that isn't recyclable, contact them by Tweet, Facebook, or Instagram. "We have gotten some positive responses but we need help with this," said Ms. Battistoni.

Migraine Headaches

Migraines are a complex disorder characterized by recurrent episodes of headache, most often unilateral and in some cases associated with visual or sensory symptoms, collectively known as an aura, which arise most often before the head pain. Migraine is most common in women and has a strong genetic component.

Typical Signs and Symptoms

- Throbbing or pulsating headache, with moderate to severe

pain that intensifies with physical activity,

- Unilateral and localized pain in the frontotemporal and ocular area, but may be felt anywhere around head or neck, with pain building over 1-2 hours, progressing to back of head and more spread out. With headache lasting 4-72 hours, with nausea and vomiting, and sensitivity to light and sound.

To be diagnosed as migraine the patient must have at least five headache attacks lasting 4-72 hours, along with two of the following characteristics: 1) Unilateral location, 2) Pulsating Quality, 3) Moderate or severe pain intensity, 4) Pain is aggravated by physical activity.

Acute treatment aims to reverse, or at least stop the progression of a headache, and is most effective if medication can be started within 15 minutes. Triptans, analgesics, non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs, and antiemetics are used for the acute treatment.

But if frequency of attacks is greater than 2 per month, or each attack lasts longer than 24 hours then prophylactic treatment may be recommended. But, as always consult your physician for professional guid-



Questing for Eagles galore on lower Connecticut River

A mid-February cruise from the dock at the Connecticut River Museum in Essex to Selden Island in Lyme was a brisk introduction to the wonders of the lower Connecticut River, where eagles soar and now nest.

Twenty-one bald eagles were spotted all told, including one that was testing out a former osprey nest and another flying past the boat with a fish in its large yellow talons. There were mature eagles with the telltale white heads and tails and younger mottled-looking ones without. February is actually well into the breeding season for our national bird, which starts laying its eggs this month in Connecticut.

The RiverQuest outing started at 2 p.m. and before it was over two hours later, several dozen bird watchers had seen a dozen species, among them great cormorants, common mergansers, black vultures, and ring-billed gulls. The eagles were a mix of locals

Continued from previous page as well as northern interlopers "wintering" in balmy Connecticut, where the water is open and the fishing

An interior enclosure, with coffee and tea, cut the winter chill, although many hardy passengers spent the trip on the foredeck. Binoculars are available for those who didn't bring them. The commentary from the crew was timely and informative not only on birds but on points of interest along the river, such as the old quarry on Selden Island that once supplied paving stones to New York City.

Once an endangered species, the bald eagle has bounced back after harmful pesticides like DDT were banned and conservation measures were undertaken. Last year, 38 nesting pairs in Connecticut produced a record 68 chicks, up from just 15 in 2007. Eagles returned to the state as a breeding species in 1992.
