ON THE ROAD WITH HADDAM HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Some Lost, Some Survive: The Stone Buildings of Haddam

Haddam is well known for its granite-gneiss quarries on both the east and west sides of the Connecticut River. The Allen Vein runs north-south across town from Haddam Neck to Great Hill then along Turkey Hill. The Brainerd and Arnold Families both operated successful quarries during the 18th and 19th centuries primarily selling curb and gutter stone to large cities along the east coast and New Orleans. The stone was also used as a building material and a few Haddam granite buildings remain.

The Haddam Gaol and Workhouse at 955 Saybrook Road was erected of local stone in three sections. The original section was constructed in 1845

by the Arnold Family with loadbearing walls of solid stone 15 to 24 inches thick. In 1855 the building was enlarged with help from the prisoners which saved \$200 in labor costs. The mansard roof portion of the building was added in 1874 and housed offices, women's quarters and Jailer's apartment.

The hybrid model at Haddam Killingworth High School has enabled us to safely and effectively continue to play instruments and sing as a part of our band and choral curriculum. In addition to working outside when the weather allows, we also spread out in the auditorium and music suite of classrooms and single practice rooms.

All choral performances are recorded individually at school as well as at home for those students who are fully remote. To ensure that it all fits together, students listen to the same record-



ing using headphones and record their voice unaccompanied. Those individual recordings are then uploaded and pieced together using the music software program Audacity. It takes hours to align each voice together and adjust volumes while filtering out page turns, background noise, etc. to get a clean recording. These are the same skills we

teach in our music production course. The final step is to add some type of video that makes the performance feel "complete".



Single-car accident on Old County Road sends two to hospital

At 7:45 p.m., Dec. 20, Haddam Volunteer Fire Company responded to a single-car motor vehicle accident on Old County Road in Higganum near the Hidden Lake Road and Killingworth Road intersection.

A section of road between Old County and Parker Hill is permanently closed and is not plowed.

A driver heading east on Old County Road failed to stop prior to the road's ending. The vehicle barreled through a three-foot-tall snowbank, and crashed into a tree.



The operator was evaluated on scene and refused additional medical treatment. Two passengers were transported to Middlesex Hospital via Haddam Volunteer Ambulance Service with minor injuries.

Marketers offering to sell or ship doses of the vaccine for payment.

RSD #17 Board of Education: summary of November meetings

2020-2021 School Year:

RSD17 continues to operate K-8 schools in a full in-person model, and the high school in a hybrid model. Superintendent Hageman reported to the Board that she meets weekly with Superintendents from the region as well as local health officials to analyze the data as it relates to keeping students in school, quarantining where we must, and following the DPH's guidelines very strictly. The state did not advocate for proactively closing schools after Thanksgiving, and Dr. Hageman continues to prioritize keeping students in school as much as possible, for as long as possible. The number of families that have chosen to learn remotely remains consistent at 11%.

2020-2021 Continuous Improvement Plans:

Each fall, the District's Principals report their school's Continuous Improvement Plan to the Board of Education. This year, given this Spring's COVID- related remote learning, the Curriculum Coordinators began the presentation with an overview of math and literacy student data from this fall. Relative to years past, there are some positive highlights of on-track learning, but in some grades and subjects areas there has been learning loss, as was expected. The Curriculum Coordinators have highlighted action steps to adjust instruction and focus on the major themes of each grade level in order to systematically close those gaps and additional supports have been put into place for students in all grade levels. Other major themes throughout the presentations included 1) ensuring all Region 17 students feel safe, respected and accepted, and 2) promoting connectedness and engagement for our students in this very unusual year. These Continuous Improvement Plans have been posted onto the RSD17.org website on each of the school's pages.

Personnel and Evaluation Subcommittee:

The Personnel Committee reported the District's plan to increase the part time nurse position at the Middle and Intermediate School Building, to a full time position. This increase would put two full-time nurses in the building, one RN and one LPN. The Committee also reported that they are currently in the middle of contract negotiations with two of the District's bargaining units.

Strategic Planning Subcommittee:

Principals, Teachers, Students, Parents, Community Members and Board of Ed members convened for a "Vision of the Graduate" kickoff meeting. This group is working to gather information from various sectors throughout our communities to identify the core skills and dispositions that are most important to see in an HK graduate. The group will meet again in December to discuss the findings from the Thought Exchange that was sent out to the community and work on next steps to complete this very important work.

Free School Meals Program:

The USDA Free School breakfast and lunch program has been extended to the end of the school year. This program is available to students who are present in school, students who are remote learning, and children that live in the community but are not enrolled in our school system. If a school, or the district, is operating in full-remote, there will be meals provided at Burr Elementary. If school is cancelled for a snow day, there will not be meals available that day. Order forms are on our RSD17.org website under District – Food Services.

the David B. Ventres House commonly known as the "stonehouse." Mr. Ventres built this house in 1825 at the time of his marriage and was involved in the quarrying business. The building once featured an ornate full façade front porch.

The final remaining stone building in Haddam is known as Brainerd Academy or Town Hall at 21 Field Park Drive. Built in 1839, this imposing building was built by brothers John and Nehemiah Brainerd as a private college preparatory school. It was originally three stories in height with massive central bell tower. The school closed in the 1890s and later became the Town Hall/Masonic Lodge in 1929 after the Courthouse/Town Hall burned (see below). The

third floor was removed and an ornate fully pedimented projecting portico was added to the façade featuring 2-story Doric columns.

We know of three stone buildings that no longer exist. The first is the Middlesex County Courthouse which stood at the intersection of Walkley Hill, Hayden Hill and Saybrook Roads. Middlesex County was formed in 1785 and Middletown and Haddam were both appointed county seats and each needed a courthouse. The stone building was erected in 1829 of Haddam gneiss and replaced an early wood structure. It remained an active courthouse until 1897 and then became the town hall and masonic lodge. A devasting fire in 1929 gutted the building and it was dismantled. The small stone wall surrounding

"Courthouse Green" was constructed of the buildings stone.

The Old Stone Store stood at the foot of Field Park Drive and was a two-story stone building with ornate fan light in the gable end. At one time George Dickinson operated a store and post office out of the building in the 1880s. It was taken down by the early 20th century.

The Charles Smith House once stood along Pokorny Road in the Higganum section of town and was built in 1802 of granite slab veneer over a rubble masonry to make 15-inch load-bearing walls. He left the house to his wife and grandson, Charles S. Wilcox, whose family remained there until the early 20th century. In the mid-20th century it was a weekend/summer home to the Briggs Family of New York, but was abandoned and fell into disrepair by the 1980s and was torn down.

Tips to Avoid a Winter Collision By Attorney Sylvia K. Rutkowska

More than 1,300 people are killed and 116,000 suffer injuries in winter vehicle collisions due to snowy, icy or slushy roads every year according to the US Department of Transportation.

The early snow this year calls for a reminder as to safe driving tips to avoid a winter collision:

- 1. Prepare your vehicle including winter tires, checking tire air pressure, inspecting windshield wipers and brake lights.
- 2. Clear your vehicle CT law requires you to remove ice and snow from your vehicle including the hood, trunk, and roof.
- 3. Stay informed pay attention to weather conditions and forecasts, and plan accordingly.
- 4. Slow down speed limits only apply to optimal weather conditions.
- 5. Increase following distance to allow plenty of space and time to stop.
- 6. Avoid abrupt movements make turns and stops slowly to avoid skidding. 7. Use your turn signal well before your turn – and to allow drivers behind you to react.
- 8. Avoid distractions including cellphones, but also talking and the radio.
- 9. Know how to recover from a skid if you have antilock brakes, press firmly on the brakes and turn into any spin; if not, pump gently on the brakes.

Unfortunately, no matter how careful you are you may still end up in a winter collision due to the negligence or carelessness of someone else. 
