Pizzeria DaVinci's 20 year legacy

(Nov. 21, 2021) — Drew Sassi opened his first Pizzeria DaVinci in Killingworth 20 years ago, in 2001. "I was born and raised in Killingworth so it was an easy choice," said Drew. Then came Moodus and Rockfall in 2004, and Higganum and Avon in 2010.

Landon, Drew's wife, thought this would be a fun "hometown" story since all of the DaVinci owners were born and raised in HK, including Drew, who graduated HKHS in '94. "Such an amazing community that has shown us so much support, especially through last year!"

"Being from a small town, it was so important for me to hire local kids and be present in the community," said Drew, and that's just what he has done.

"I met Doug [Felton] 23 years ago when I would see him biking around Killingworth with his fishing pole on the back, at 15 years old," Drew said. "I asked him if he wanted a job and he never looked back. Doug is like my first-born child at this point." In 2004, Doug went with Drew to Rockfall to run that location. "I would come by [the store] on Doug's days off, and he would be mowing the lawn!" said Drew. Doug also helped manage the Moodus store.

Then they opened Avon together as partners. "In true Doug fashion, he put everything into the store and became the official 100% owner last year," said Drew.

Chris Bova was introduced into the DaVinci family at age 14; his mother owned a dog grooming shop next door. One day Chris came into DaVinci's for a slice of pizza, and Drew said, "How about a job instead?" As the story goes, "That very moment, Drew got me behind the line and was training me to make pies just like that," said Chris.

"Chris is such a special person, with the best heart," said Drew. "You can't be in a bad mood around Chris. He's like the annoying little brother I never wanted. Just last night he was sending Landon videos from about 15 years ago of the pranks we all used to pull on each other."

Though Chris has been the face of the

Killingworth DaVinci for over a decade, he has only been the owner since 2017 when he officially bought the store. He resides in Killingworth with his wife and son, and "has future aspirations of opening another DaVinci one day," said Chris.

2021 Summary of October 2021 meetings

Superintendent Transition: In October, the District welcomed Jeff Wihbey as the new RSD17 Superintendent of Schools. Superintendent Wihbey presented his Entry Plan which includes conducting facility inspections, reviewing policies, contracts, and budgets, and holding interviews and focus groups with stakeholders throughout the community. At the completion of the entry plan, the Superintendent's observations, data analysis, and stakeholder feedback will be shared formally with the Board and at PTO and faculty meetings across the district. The Board has asked Interim Superintendent JeanAnn Paddyfote to stay on through the end of her contract to create an Employee Handbook, write district job descriptions, update district policies, and support the Superintendent during the transition.

Strategic Plan: As part of its strategic planning process launched this spring, Regional School District 17 is conducting a district-wide survey until December 1, 2021. The survey is open to employees, parents, students, recent alumni and community members without students in the District. Involvement of the entire community is important to the long-term framework for decision-making that builds upon the common values held by the RSD17 community. The survey can be found at www.rsd17. org/district/rsd17-strategic-planning-survey

District Update Emails: The Board of Education announces a new way for Haddam and Killingworth residents to stay up-to-date with District information by signing up for email updates. Through a partnership with the Towns of Haddam and Killingworth's alert system, District emails will include board meeting summaries, occasional surveys, and information on Annual Budgets and Referendums. You can also sign up to receive updates and alerts from Haddam and/ or Killingworth. Sign up for email updates at www. rsd17.org/community/haddam-and-killingworthalerts

Science Textbook Update: The Curriculum Subcommittee recommended, and the Board agreed, to update the AP Biology textbook. The AP Board recommends textbooks be updated every 10 years, and the current textbooks are from 2011. The AP Biology curriculum is being updated to focus less on memorization and more on the scientific thought process, integrating more authentic research and incorporating online study guides.

Facilities Assessment: The Facilities Committee has received a 300 page draft of the facilities assessment report from Tecton Architects. The firm's representatives gave the committee an overview of the report and the committee sent the firm back with notes of interest and areas of concern for follow up and research. The goal is to have a presentation to the full Board in December.

Finance Committee Update: Like last year, the finance committee is tracking unexpected Covidrelated expenses. As of six weeks into school, approximately \$26,000 has been spent on additional hires and equipment. The committee also reported that the initial look at the unaudited balance from the end of the last fiscal year had two items to note; an increase in approximately \$113,000 in fuel costs and about \$90,000 in revenue from the Excess Cost Share Grant.

Alphabet Soup: Common Workers' Compensation Slang Explained **By Attorney Alexander J. Sarris**

Workers' compensation is a complex legal system filled with many abbreviations completely foreign to the uninitiated. Below is a brief summary of common phrases:

- <u>FRI / FROI</u> \rightarrow First Report of Incident. Should be completed and provided to the employer within the same day of any workplace accident.
- <u> $30C \rightarrow$ </u> Formal notice to both the employer and the proper Workers' Compensation Commission District of a workplace accident.
- <u>1A</u> \rightarrow Formal confirmation of personal classifications to ensure accurate benefits.
- <u>AWW</u> \rightarrow Average Weekly Wages. Gross weekly wages received. Typically calculated over the 52 weeks preceding the date of work injury.

- <u>BCR</u> \rightarrow Basic Compensation Rate. Adjusted workers' compensation pay rate. Typically about twothirds of the employees' standard pay rate.
- TT \rightarrow Temporary Total Disability. An indemnity benefit paid when an injured worker is out of work indefinitely.
- <u>TP</u> \rightarrow Temporary Partial Disability. An indemnity benefit paid when an injured worker has work restrictions that cannot be accommodated by the employer. Common for the employee to complete job search forms for these benefits.
- $\underline{MMI} \rightarrow Maximum Medical Improvement$. The point in treatment when an injured worker has plateaued in medical recovery and reached a new baseline after treatment.
- <u>PPD</u> \rightarrow Permanent Partial Disability. Another indemnity benefit that reflects the percentage impairment suffered to the affected body part. Assigned by a physician and typically determined at the time of MMI.

CT State Police: Lock your cars!

(Nov. 19, 2021) — In recent years, we have seen a trend across the State of Connecticut and across the country of an increase in vehicle break-ins and vehicle thefts. These types of crimes tend to be occurring in residential neighborhoods across the state during the overnight hours; and unfortunately the Town of Haddam has not been immune to these types of incidents. In the vast majority of cases, unlocked vehicles are entered during the overnight hours and thieves help themselves to personal belongings. Many times, when keys/fobs are left within unsecured vehicles, the thieves steal the vehicle itself.

This is not a new phenomenon, however it does seem to be getting more media attention as of late. This is a good thing, as these types of crimes are getting more attention within the State Legislature in Hartford. Changes to current juvenile laws (in particular) will be a cornerstone in allowing Law Enforcement to more effectively address this growing problem. In the meantime, Troop F personnel are making it a point to conduct frequent checks of residential neighborhoods; especially during the overnight hours.

We have found that much more often than not, unlocked vehicles are targeted. Thieves tend to focus on this "low hanging fruit," as they are easy targets. The simplest, most effective, and most immediate solution to address these types of crimes in Haddam and also other communities is to lock you vehicle, secure valuables, and do not leave your keys in your vehicle. In addition, "if you see something, say something." State Police Troop F is manned 24/7 and someone is always available to take your call day or night. Should residents witness suspicious persons, vehicles, or activity day or night; they are asked to please contact Troop F right away and a Trooper will respond to assist/investigate. The non-emergency phone number to Troop F is 860-399-2100 Option "#4". For emergencies, always dial 9-1-1.

Please feel free to notify your Resident State Troopers of any suspicious activity in your neighborhood. However, if you witness suspicious activity, it is best not to wait and to notify Troop F immediately so a Trooper can respond in real time. In these types of cases, we have found that prevention is far more effective than prescription. Taking a few extra seconds to lock vehicles, secure valuables, and take your keys is often all it takes to not fall victim of these types of crimes that, unfortunately, have become all too common in our state.

Pizzeria DaVinci in 2009. "I fell in love with it pretty quickly," said Emily, "and spent as much time as I possibly could working and learning what I needed to know. My goal was to become the youngest PDV owner in company history."

"In 2016, external events forced me to take a little break from the pizza life," Emily explained. "In 2019, I returned with a roaring fire inside to finish what I had started."

"Emily approached me for a job in 2019 for part time at the Moodus location," said Drew. "I wasn't even hiring at the time, but I knew I couldn't pass. We actually created a position for her." Drew offered Emily the head management position in the Higganum store.

"Originally, the deal was that I spend two years in the Higganum location, structuring it the way my other two PDV locations were structured, and then I would go on to open my own," said Emily. "As time went on, plans changed... into my wildest dreams! I was offered a partnership with Drew and Landon in the Pizzeria Da Vinci brand. As a partner, my role is to search for, open, and establish new Pizzeria Da Vinci locations and oversee them as they grow."

"Everything really does happen for a reason," said Drew, "because Covid hit five months later, and because of cancer I was advised to stay out of the restaurants and Emily kept everything running."

"As the pandemic has thrown new challenges from

every angle, we have seen a lot of setbacks in our goals to expand the brand," said Emily. "I will remain in the Higganum location until we have the staff to run it without me; at which point, our venture to expand will be my main focus."

"She runs circles around me and everyone else," said Drew. "We always laugh because some of our security cameras can't even keep up with Emily!"

Hunter Czaja is the most recent member of the DaVinci family. "Hunter started working for me at 16 in Higganum," explained Drew. "My wife always says I am hardest on the employees I see the most potential in, and that isn't truer with anyone than it is Hunter. I have been doing this a long time and have worked with a lot of amazing kids. I can't think of anyone who is more of a team player than Hunter."

"I love his work ethic and kindness, but I can honestly say I don't think I have ever met someone with more integrity," Drew went on to say. "He has such a unique leadership style; he's like everyone's big brother. If I call him with accolades, he always credits the team, and if I call him with criticism, he puts the blame on himself as their leader.

"Landon and I were given the opportunity to buy back the Moodus location from my former brotherin-law in 2019," explained Drew. "I almost turned it down because I was stretched thin and Landon suggested a partnership with Hunter. He accepted and never looked back. He will officially be the sole owner of Moodus in 2024."



HVFC Responds to Propane Tank Leak on Embassy Drive

At 4:30 p.m. on Nov. 18, 2021 Haddam Volunteer Fire Company was dispatched to a residence on Embassy Drive in Higganum for a reported leaking propane tank. The homeowners noticed the smell of propane in the air shortly after the fuel was delivered.

After determining there was indeed a leak at the bottom of the tank, HVFC called for Guilford Fire Department's Hazmat Team, which came equipped with a flare stack and other equipment.

A flare stack—referred to Guilford firefighters as "the red Dragon"—is used to burn vapor and pressurized liquid from the propane tank. This eliminates gas spilling onto the ground and harming the environment.

Flaring the entire tank took about an hour, according to Fire Chief Sam Baber.


