HVFC Responds: Vehicle accident on Parker Hill Rd.

At 3:05 p.m. on Dec. 22, Haddam Volunteer Fire Company responded to a motor vehicle accident on Parker Hill Road South with reported wires down and possible entrapment. A driver, heading south-bound, hit and snapped a utility pole. Firefighters asked the driver to remain inside the vehicle until Eversource could secure the power. Once the power was secured, the patient was removed and transported to Middlesex Hospital.

KVFC members hone skills in roof ventilation in Madison

On Monday, December 13, 2021, over 20 members of the Killingworth Volunteer Fire Company (KVFC) traveled down to a soon-to-be demolished building in Madison to hone their skills in vertical ventilation fire-speak for quickly cutting large holes in the roof of a burning building to release pressurized smoke and heated gases. Once the smoke is released from the roof, visibility is improved for those firefighters inside who can more easily find and remove victims and extinguish the fire.

During the training, members practiced using the Department's roof saws (chainsaws outfitted with special roof guards) and K-12 saws, which are designed to cut through not



only standard asphalt shingles, but rubber, metal or stone covered roofs, to cut large (4'x4') openings in the roof. Once the section of roof is removed, firefighters then use hand tools to push and/or pull-out insulation and drywall to allow the smoke and gases to escape. During an actual structure fire, firefighters aim to have the roof cut open and fire vented in less than 5 minutes which is why proper technique and a good understanding of roles and responsibilities is critical. In addition to the venting itself, safe use of the saws, roof ladders, hand tools and coordination amongst teams operating inside the building is essential to ensure the task is handled quickly and efficiently, but also in a manner that allows each firefighter to make it back down on the ground safely.

Members of the KVFC would like to thank the Madison Hose Company #1 for allowing them to use the building for training. We are fortunate to have such great working relationships with our neighboring fire departments with whom we work closely throughout the year.



Middlesex Health changes visiting hours **December 22**

MIDDLETOWN (Dec. 22, 2021) — With

COVID-19 numbers on the rise, Middlesex Health is changing its visiting hours and encouraging patients to communicate with loved ones virtually. The changes go into effect today.

Visiting hours at Middlesex Hospital, located at 28 Crescent Street in Middletown, are now 2:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. - both on the weekdays and during theweekend. Visitors must register at the front desk in the hospital lobby and be 16 or older unless granted special permission.

Regardless of whether they are vaccinated, all visitors must wear a face mask at all times while at any Middlesex Health facility, including in patient rooms. Visitors in patients' rooms who are found not wearing their masks will be asked to leave the facility. There are no exceptions to this rule. All visitors will also be screened for COVID-19 symptoms upon arrival.

All Middlesex Health locations, including Middlesex Hospital, outpatient locations and ambulatory settings, are allowing patients one visitor per day unless they are on respiratory precautions, such as presumed or confirmed COVID-19 patients. Patients on respiratory precautions, such as presumed or confirmed COVID-19 patients, are not allowed visitors. The hospital's inpatient behavioral unit is also not allowing visitors at this time.

One visitor can accompany Middlesex Health's Emergency Department patients 24 hours a day, seven days a week. It must be the same person throughout the patient's stay, and they can enter through the Emergency Department entrance. Pregnancy and Birth Center patients may have one visitor throughout their stay in addition to their primary support person.

There are some exceptions to these rules. They include:

- · Visitors making compassionate care visits
- Visitors making disability care visits

• Birthing partners for Pregnancy and Birth Center patients

• Pediatric patients

• Clergy visits (Members of the clergy should not visit patients who are on special respiratory precautions unless it is a compassionate visit.)

Visitors arriving under these special circumstances may visit 24 hours a day, seven days a week. If they arrive when the hospital lobby is closed, they should go to the Emergency Department main entrance.

As a reminder, in lieu of in-person visits, patients and their families may opt to communicate virtually. The use of FaceTime or Google Duo on personal devices is encouraged. Using Zoom on health system iPads may also be an option.

Summary of November 2021 meetings

Cougar Pride: Superintendent Jeff Wihbey explained how he will be starting each Board of Education meeting with Cougar Pride, recognizing the accomplishments of our staff and students at HK. In November, the HKMS Unified Sports team was highlighted. HKMS Unified Sports began in 2010 with a partnership between the CIAC and the Special Olympics. This program takes a modified approach to a variety of sports, allowing students of all abilities to participate alongside mentor students and represent HK in competitions. The HK Unified Sports team has won multiple awards in CT and been a model for other schools to build their own Unified Sports teams. Middle School teachers Becky Templeton and Andrea Darmanin were recognized for leading this year's team.

Additionally Superintendent Wihbey recognized the HKHS Boys and Girls Cross Country teams for both winning a Class SS State Championship Title. This is the third time since 2015 that both teams have won in the same year. Additional High School recognitions went to the HKHS Girls Volleyball team for winning the Shoreline Championship, the HKHS Drama's

production of Clue, which sold out to a limited audience, and finally to the twenty-one students who were inducted to HKHS National Honor Society.

State COVID restrictions relaxed: Superintendent Jeff Wihbey reported on two new Covid related updates from the CT Department of Health, which will allow RSD17 to alter operations toward a less restrictive environment for our staff and students. The first allows Districts to open up arts and music performances for parents to attend. The second, titled "Screen and Stay," gives guidance on reducing quarantine restrictions for staff and students after experiencing a close contact at school, whether they are vaccinated or not. The Superintendent will work with the District Medical Advisor, Administrators, and the local health districts to come up with a solid plan and communication strategy to adopt "Screen and Stay" at RSD17.

Social Emotional Learning: The District's Student Services Department is participating in a pilot program offered by the Connecticut State Department of Education that will enable RSD 17 to monitor all students' Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) using

Board of Finance meeting summary






