Francis Barkyoumb of Killingworth will be opening Glass Dance Studio located at 616A East Main Street, Route 1, Branford, CT 06405.

Francis will be taking over Jayne Crowley's J.C. Art Glass Design studio space at Hilltop Orchards. Jayne has been a stained-glass artist in Branford for 48 years and will be retiring to her new home studio where she will be continuing her glass art creations. Francis, of Glass Dance Studio, has been doing stained glass art for nearly fifteen years and has been working under Jayne's supervision with stained glass restorations for the past several months in

preparation for this transition. "You cannot put a value on the opportunity and education I have gained working alongside Jayne these last several months," said Francis. "She is a legend in the stained-glass artisan world. Our common vision is to assure the ancient art of stained glass stays alive in Connecticut and is passed along for generations to come. Restoration of churches, lamps and other art works is all about saving an incredibly beautiful piece of history."





How to Watch Short Track Speed Skater Kristen Santos at 2022 Beijing Olympics

Donna gives this advice, "When looking for events, be sure to look for the words 'short track' and not speed skating. There are two types of speed skating: short track and long track. The words 'short track' distinguishes the two."

Donna told us that Kristen will be skating in five events: 500 meter, 1000 meter, 1500 meter, women's relay, and mixed relay.

This link tells how to watch short track speed skating at the Olympics February 5-16, however, these are the "live" times in China. "With the 13 hour time difference, some events start live at 6:00 a.m. EST," explained Donna. "I'm thinking NBC/Peacock will replay them at later times as well throughout the day."

Donna also explained how the competition works for us novices. "There are several rounds before one can get to the medaling rounds. For example, the 500-meter starts off with a heat; the top two finishers advance to a quarterfinal round. From the quarterfinal round, the top two advance to the semi-final round. From the semi-final round, the top two advance to the medaling round, also known as the 'A' final round. The 'B' final round consists of the 3rd and 4th place finishers of the semi-final round."

Now you know how to watch Kristen at the Olympics. Let's cheer her on!

HADDAM HISTORY

Where Is Haddam's Potter's Field?

We've been digging around for the graves of Joseph, Grace, and Jacob Ball, murdered in Tylerville in 1915 and dug up in a Potter's Field in Haddam in 1921 for the well-publicized trial of Emil Schutte.

So far, we haven't found the location of that Potter's Field. Daniel Hearn's 2019 book, "Legal Executions in New England," reports the following about the 1921 investigation of the Ball family murder. "At first the gravediggers could not remember exactly where they had buried the three decedents. Many other coffins were disinterred and opened by mistake before the right ones were found." If they couldn't remember the 1915 burial spots in 1921, certainly no one remembers them now. So where might this Potter's Field be? And why is it called a Potter's Field? A Potter's Field is for the burial of unknown, unclaimed, or indigent people. In the book of Matthew, before hanging himself, Judas returned to the high priests the 30 pieces of silver they had paid him to betray Jesus.

Considering this "blood money," the priests decided not to put it in the church treasury. Instead they used it to buy land for the burial of strangers, criminals and the poor. Prior to this purchase, that plot of land had been



the site where potters collected high quality clay to produce fine ceramics. Thus that plot of land was unusable for agriculture and was called Potter's Field.

The Potter's Field in Washington Square, Philadelphia, near Independence Hall, was used for yellow fever victims, prison inmates, and mass burials for Revolutionary War soldiers.

So where is Haddam's Potter's Field in which the Ball family was interred, dis-interred, and hopefully re-interred. Any ideas?







Rev. Robert W. Herrmann-Keeling, 84, formerly of Higganum, died peacefully at his home in Middletown, CT on February 2, 2022. He was born

in Rugby, ND on January 5, 1938 to Dr. Wilbur and Jennie (Ferguson) Keeling.

Haddam Volunteer Fire Company 2021 Annual Report

Haddam Volunteer Fire Company received a total of 528 calls for emergency services in 2021. This is 65 more incidents than 2020.

Those incidents included:

37 fires (structures, vehicles, forest, cooking) 290 medicals

68 motor vehicle accidents

9 rescues (extrication of victims from buildings, swimming areas)

10 hazardous conditions (flammable liquid or chemical spills, gas leaks, carbon monoxide incidents, smoke scares)

30 electrical (power lines down, shorted electrical equipment)

- 14 mutual aid/station coverage
- 21 dispatched and canceled en route
- 32 malfunctioning or false alarm activations (smoke and carbon monoxide detectors)

17 others (storm assessment, lock-outs, smoke removal, steam leak, etc.)

HVFC volunteers spent more than 2,420 combined hours responding to calls, and an additional 2,771 hours participating in meetings, drills, and training.

Several members obtained new certifications. Sierra Statkiewicz and Lee Swolka earned their EMT certifications; John Shettleworth and Lieutenant Charles "Chuck" Kowal passed the Connecticut

Firefighter I course; and Daní Rodriguez also earned his EMT, passed both FFI and FFII, and completed a Rapid Intervention/Safety and Survival course at the Middlesex County Fire School. Lieutenant Kris Proto and Jarrod Ramsey completed FFII and are currently taking EMT training. Captain Jeff Doskos and Deputy Chief Jed Morrissey completed a Heavy Vehicle Extrication course offered by FDNY RES1CUE. Assistant Chief Peter Brown obtained his Fire Service Instructor II and EMS Instructor certifications. In addition, he became a State of Connecticut certified Human Trafficking Instructor and has already taught a class to HVFC members.

Years of service pins were awarded to Firefighter Rich Williams (45 years); Assistant Chief Peter Brown (10 years); Firefighter Nate Meyer (10 years); Lieutenant Charles "Chuck" Kowal (5 years); Firefighter Zach Ouellette (5 years); Company Treasurer Michelle Lafo (5 years); and Fire Police Scott Miller (5 years).

HVFC mourns the loss of two Life Members who passed away in 2021: John "Jack" Cernan, 83, and David Bugbee, 60. And we welcome new members Marc Perras, who came up from the Junior Division, and Mike Mancuso!

With COVID-19 restrictions lifted, members of

HVFC were pleased to return to several in-person activities such as hosting our annual Children's Christmas Party, Old Timers' Night for Life Members; marching in Higganum's annual Memorial Day parade and chowder-making; participating in a "live burn" with Essex firefighters; and providing fire standby at Haddam River Days fireworks and the Durham Fair. Members also assisted the community during Tropical Storm Henri and the Tropical Storm Elsa, where crews responded to 10 incidents over two days.
