# Déjà vu all over again: Killingworth **Ambulance Association cancels EMT class**

For the second time in the past six months, the Killingworth Ambulance Association (KAA) has been forced to cancel its EMT classes. The course was scheduled to begin on Tuesday, January 11, but after careful consideration the KAA's chief of service, Mike Haaga, decided to shut it down.

The reason: Simple. Not enough students.

"Only two people," said Haaga, who teaches the course with wife Marguerite, the KAA's vice president. "I really wanted to run the class, and I thought about it all day, but it's such a time commitment for two people."

According to Haaga, communications with a Connecticut state official indicated that attendance for recent EMT classes state-wide has declined substantially.

"Probably has to do with COVID," Haaga said.

The KAA had hoped to initiate its annual fall course on September 2, 2021, but cancelled that instruction due to a lack of participants. That marked the third consecutive autumn the KAA had to move or cancel its EMT course. In 2019, it was moved to January 2020, because of insufficient enrollment. One year later, it was shut down because of the COVID pandemic. Then it was cancelled again last fall.

"Very disappointing," said Haaga.

The last time a course was completed was in 2020, and that was a success. Ten students participated, with ten completing the course including one remotely from Idaho – and six joining the KAA. Courses historically last threeand-a-half months, with classes held Tuesday and Thursday evenings, as well as five Saturdays.

No date has been set for future instruction.

"We'll shoot for another fall class," said Haaga.

Recipe: Millionaire's Shortbread

Time: 50 minutes Yield: 16 servings

This dessert not only looks like a million bucks, it tastes like it, too! Crispy, buttery shortbread topped with layers of gooey caramel and smooth chocolate. This is a shareable treat that everyone will love! They look so impressive yet come together in under an hour.

#### **Ingredients**

- 2 & 1/4 cups flour
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 3/4 cup butter
- 7 tablespoons butter
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1 can sweetened condensed milk (14 ounces)
- 3/4 cup semi-sweet or milk chocolate chips

#### **Directions**

Step 1

Grease a 9×13 baking dish or line with parchment paper. Preheat your oven to 350 degrees F.

Step 2

In a mixing bowl or the bowl of your stand mixer, combine flour and granulated sugar. Cube the 3/4 cups of butter and mix into the flour mixture with a pastry cutter, your hands, or

a fork until it's a crumbly texture. Press dough into the pan for your shortbread crust. Prick all over with a fork.

Step 3

Bake crust for about 20 minutes until lightly golden. Set aside and allow to cool.

Step 4

In a medium saucepan over medium-low heat, add the 7 tablespoons of butter, condensed milk, and brown sugar. Stir constantly until the butter has melted. Create your caramel by gently bringing contents to a boil while still keeping the heat on low. This will require you to stir vigorously for 5-10 minutes. Once it thickens and becomes a nice caramel brown, pour it over the crust and allow it to cool. To speed up your process, you can cover with foil and place dish in the refrigerator while you prepare the chocolate layer.

Step 5

Melt the chocolate in the microwave or in a saucepan on low, careful not to burn. Spread the chocolate layer evenly over the top of the completely cooled caramel layer. Once that has cooled, cut into bars and serve. Enjoy!



# RSD #17 Board of Education: Summary of December 2021 Meetings

Cougar Pride: HKIS Principal Eric Larson invited the cast of the school's Lion King production for a special presentation for the Board and Community. Music Teacher and show director, Katherine Jones, led an ensemble performance from the show which was held before a live audience in November.

Superintendent Wihbey reported that the HKHS Robotics club competed with two robots against 65 teams from Connecticut and Massachusetts. The students were required to modify robots, update programming code and troubleshoot issues throughout the day. This was the first robotics competition for many on the team and they will be competing again in January in Middletown.

Superintendent's Update: Superintendent Jeff Wihbey presented an overview of the fifty new bills pertaining to school districts that had been passed in the 2021 Legislative Session and June special session. These bills range from curriculum updates and mental health wellness days for students, to training required for the hiring process and requirements for providing annual staffing reports to local unions. Many of these new unfunded mandates will require additional resources and work from the District.

Board Committee Chairs Named: In December, the Board of Education welcomed three new members: Lisa Connelly from Killingworth and Hamish MacPhail and Corey Roberts from Haddam. With the election of a new Board comes the appointments of new Executive Board Members, Committee Chairs, Committee Members and Liaisonships. The new Executive Board elected are Suzanne Sack – Chair, Jennifer Favalora – Vice Chair, Peter Sonski – Treasurer, and Joel D'Angelo – Secretary. Committee Chairs are Shawna Goldfarb

Communications, Kathy Zandi – Curriculum, Peter
 Sonski – Facilities, Peter Sonski – Finance, Suzanne
 Sack – Personnel & Evaluation, Nelson Rivera –
 Policy, Jennifer Favalora alongside Prem Aithal as a non-voting member – Strategic Planning.

Average Daily Membership (ADM) – Superintendent Wihbey shared the October 2021 Average Daily Membership for the Towns of Haddam and Killingworth. The ADM determines the assessment to each town in the form of a percentage of the number of students each town has related to total enrollment. For 2022-2023, Haddam's share is 61.20% and Killingworth's is 38.80%, which will be an increased assessment for Haddam.

School Continuous Improvement Plans Each year the Administrators report on District progress in the

last year and areas they are going to work towards in the next year in the Curriculum Improvement Reports. Curriculum Coordinators Heather Rigatti and Jenn Beermunder reviewed state testing results from the Spring, which confirmed previous data on learning loss in both Math and Science. Each of the Principals shared the themes for this year in their schools. Major themes across all schools included Adjusting and Accelerating Instruction for Academic Growth, Supporting Individual Social-Emotional Wellness, Building and Maintaining Positive School Culture, and Ensuring that the students feel accepted and respected.

# UConn Extension Service Offers January Gardening Tips

By UConn Extension Service staff

January is a good time to browse through garden catalogs and get orders submitted for spring gardening. In 2020 and 2021 many seeds were sold out early.

Make sure any stored bulbs, corms, or tubers are not rotting or too dry. Discard rotted ones and lightly mist shriveled ones.

Prune most stone fruit trees

Check all house plants closely for insect infestations. Quarantine gift plants until you determine that they are not harboring any pests. Inspect under leaves for infestations of whitefly and spider mites; check between leaves and stems for white, cottony mealybugs, and look under leaves and on stems for scale insects. Apply insecticidal soap or another low toxicity insecticide, crush insects or brush off as appropriate.

When planning your vegetable garden, remember to rotate crops.

Inspect trees and shrubs for bark damage. If found, likely voles, rabbits or deer may be the culprits. Spray with an appropriate deterrent or place material such as wire mesh or bird netting to exclude browsing animals until spring.

If weather is dry and soil is not frozen, water

evergreens like rhododendrons.

Keep foot traffic to a minimum on dormant lawns to prevent damage to crowns.

Keep birdbaths full- remove ice and refill as needed.

Clean crusty pots by soaking them in vinegar for a few hours. Heavily crusted pots might require additional scrubbing with steel wool. Rinse thoroughly and then to sterilize, dip in a 1:10 bleach to water solution for a few minutes. Rinse and dry.

# January 10, 2022 Haddam Board of Selectmen Meeting

On Monday, January 10, 2022, the Haddam Board of Selectmen (BOS) held its first regular meeting in the new year. The meeting was called to order, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited, the meeting agenda was approved, and minutes for the December 13, 2021 meeting were approved as amended (with a change to strike an incomplete sentence within the original minutes offered by Selectman Kate Anderson).

During the public comment period, Haddam resident Maurice Adams asked whom he could contact for a copy of the Connecticut Communities Challenge grant application once the Town has submitted it (January 14). First Selectman Bob McGarry responded that Adams could contact Town Planner Bill Warner about that matter.

McGarry provided an update on a variety of projects in town, including the recent receipt of \$1.8 million for Scovil hoe clean-up. McGarry expects that finalization of paperwork and requirements "will fall into place." The Beaver Meadow Road culvert project came in under the bidding price and estimated cost. Bids have also come in for the Bridge Road sidewalks, with the low bid being over the project price. According to McGarry, the increased Town's portion will have to be approved at a Town meeting. The Blueway Commons, Brookes Court, and Island Dock Road projects are all "moving forward."

Scott Brookes' term as Town Clerk ended on December 31, 2021. Bob Siegrist became Town Clerk on January 4, 2022. There was a luncheon held for Brookes to thank him for his service to Haddam.

A new Building Inspector has been hired. Robert Ruzzo was the building inspector for South Windsor.

Coronavirus cases are "rising dramatically," McGarry stated. There have been home test and mask distributions at Haddam Killingworth High School. He noted the State of Connecticut has a website that contains videos on how to utilize different kinds of home tests. Old Saybrook has opened a new drive-thru test center, McGarry pointed out. "Vaccinations are available, as are boosters," although McGarry noted that he has "no for Disease Control and Prevention keeps changing

Selectman Kate Anderson announced that the Economic Development Commission (EDC) is Wednesday of each month.


