H. Gordon Chasseaud: Haddam's Distinguished World War I Veteran

Born in Brooklyn, NY, on November 20, 1887, Herve Gordon Chasseaud (usually written as "H. Gordon Chasseaud") joined the service in the U.S. Army as a 2nd Lieutenant during World War I. Chasseaud was usually known to his friends and neighbors as "Gordon." Gordon Chasseaud initially kept a home both in Brooklyn and in Haddam, CT, where he lived with his wife and his mother, Emma. In 1912, his parents bought a summer home on 946 Saybrook Road from the Smith family. Later, after teaching French for many years at St. Albans School, Chasseaud spent his retirement years in the

A summer youth program that brings young people, seniors, veterans and local volunteers together will work to restore Camp Bethel, a National Historic Site on the banks of the Connecticut River.



Killingworth Ambulance Association Responded to More Calls, Fall Victims in 2021

The number of emergency responses by the Killingworth Ambulance Association jumped dramatically in 2021, but the cause of those calls did not.

As was the case in 2020, victims of falls led all responses, followed by sick persons and individuals with breathing problems. Those were the same three (though not in that order) that led all calls in 2020 when the KAA responded to 370 emergencies.

So nothing different there.

But look at the number of calls compiled by the KAA. There were 496 in 2021, a 34 percent increase over the previous year. Now look at the number of fall victims. There were 117 in 2021, or 23.6 percent of the total. There were 71 last year, or 19.2 percent of the total, and 75 the year before.

That's a 64.7 percent hike in one year, and one that's not easy to explain.

"We didn't pass on as many calls last year," said Mike Haaga, the KAA's chief of service, searching for an explanation, "so that made our call volume higher. Second, we did more mutual-aid calls to other towns. I don't know if there was a COVID 'rebound,' where people weren't calling the ambulance (in 2020) because of COVID and then thought it had subsided. But they may have been calling for more things."

That might explain the number of calls for sick persons. That figure jumped from 36 in 2020 (9.7

percent) to 62 one year later, or 12.3 percent of the total. Breathing problems, however, did not increase. In fact, they were unchanged. Where there were 36 in 2020, there were 36 the following year.

What follows are the Top Five KAA calls for 2021: Fall victims ... 117 (23.6) Sick persons ...62 (12.3) Breathing problems ... 36 (7.3) Chest pain ... 26 (5.2) Altered mental status ... 25 (5.0) What's intriguing about these figures is that, for the

first time in years, traffic accidents didn't make the Top Five. Instead, they were sixth with 25 responses, or 4.8 percent of the total. In 2019, for example, they were second, with 35 calls (9.9 percent).

But that was before COVID arrived.

Here's a comparison with the Top Five of 2020:

Fall victims ... 71 (19.2)

Breathing problems 36 (9.7)

Sick persons ... 35 (9.5)

Not entered ... 32 (8.6)

Traffic accidents ... 25 (6.8)

Also of interest in 2021 were responses for unconscious persons or individuals who fainted. In 2020, there were only five. That number jumped to 12 one year later, or 2.4 percent of the total and one more than there were in 2019 (11).

KAA figures are kept annually, with calls recorded electronically on patient-care reports by EMTs on the scene.

Maurice Dale Adams



Maurice Dale Adams, who passed away in his home on April 27, 2022, was best known in Haddam because he showed up—to everything! From board of finance, to land use, to planning and zoning, to board of education meetings, you name it, Maurice was there. Always asking questions, always taking leaders to task, always making insightful recommendations, and always with an optimistic smile saying, "We're going to make this happen." He acted out of a growing concern for climate change, striving to educate himself and others on lessening human-caused changes to the Earth's environment.

And he made things happen. For example:

- He led a group of concerned citizens to challenge the supposed "benefits" of having freight trains carrying toxic materials and petroleum run through Haddam and along the Connecticut River.
- He became a founding member of the Haddam News, writing articles to inform the public about important local and environmental issues.
- He conceived of and promoted The CT River Green&BlueWay – a 30-mile long multiuse 'rail-with-trail' scenic, recreational, and tourist corridor running along the CT river from Middletown to Old Saybrook.
- He served on RiverCOG's Regional Planning Commission and fought tirelessly to motivate the Commission to prioritize environmental and 'smart' economic growth considerations.
- He brought people together to try and transform the decommissioned CT Yankee Nuclear power plant into a renewable energy demonstration site and energy storage facility.

Maurice was not from Haddam, but in 2004 he followed his best friend Reuben Trane to the area and built a cabin overlooking the Connecticut River for everyone to enjoy. In that cabin, he spent his last days peacefully with his wife, Elizabeth, two sons, Moe and Alex, and daughter, Emily, by his side. Maurice's family and friends will be invited to celebrate his life this summer, details to be provided at a later date.

H. Gordon Chasseaud: Haddam's Distinguished World War I Veteran

Higganum section of Haddam, living near the Shad Museum.

Chasseaud's facility with French became enormously important during the war, as most of the major battles in the Great War took place in France. He served as a liaison officer between the French government and the United States Army during the war. Later, he served with great distinction on the Commission for Relief in Belgium (the CRB) during and after the war.

Following is a summary of the CRB's mission:

Herbert Hoover founded the Commission for Relief in Belgium (CRB) in London in October 1914 as a private organization to provide food for Germanoccupied Belgium. Belgium's attempts at resistance to German military demands at the outbreak of the Great War had aroused much popular sympathy in England and the United States. A densely populated, industrialized country, Belgium depended on imports for three-quarters of its normal food supply. When the German Army began to requisition local foodstuffs and the British blockade cut off imported sources, 7 million Belgians faced severe hunger as the winter of 1914-1915 approached. When the American ambassador in London, Walter Hines Page, met with Belgian representatives, they concluded that Herbert Hoover was the best choice to administer some emergency relief action. The comprehensiveness of the program, however, was the result of Hoover's personal determination to feed the entire nation.

The CRB conducted its humanitarian work on an unprecedented scale and with a unique administrative organization... The basic facts hint at the scope and complexity of the undertaking. Between 1914 and 1919, the CRB dispensed nearly \$1 billion in order to feed 9 million Belgian and French citizens behind German lines.




Gordon Chasseaud received two medals for his distinguished service for helping the people of Belgium and France. Here is an article from the Hartford Courant describing one of his awards:

"Haddam, Aug. 28, 1919: H. Gordon Chasseaud of Brooklyn and Haddam has received the following notice: "By a dispatch of ...His Majesty the King of Belgium has conferred upon you "The Medal of King Albert." In recognition of this high distinction, His Majesty has voiced the sentiments of gratitude of all the Belgium People."

Gordon Chaseaud lived on Old Saybrook Road in Higganum for many years. He died at age 79 in





1967 and is buried in the Haddam Cemetery with his parents, Jasper and Ella, and his wife, Marion, who died in 1978 at age 87. He had no children.
