Kathy Brown Retires from HK News

Whenever someone leaves who has been part of an organization for a long time, in this case since the start of the original HaddamNow.com online paper, it always seems that it takes two or three people to fill their shoes. In this case it can be said that there are at least six of us who are expanding what we do to cover what Kathy Brown has been doing for the past nine years.

Anthony Giamei recalls that "Kathy met with us in the fall of 2013 and proposed starting HaddamNow as an online service to the community. She was quite confident that it could work, but I was somewhat skeptical. I had run an online site before and knew that it can be a lot of work. Then there was the matter of how to pay for it. So, Ed was going to pull a bunch of founders together, and I was to create a business plan. Kathy's brother had some experience with websites, and we had some legal experts on board. We found a marketing guy who was going to set up the domain name, hosting service and site design. Our business plan was presented to a few of our founders, and some were skeptical. The plan needed some tweaking. Ed was to be advertising manager. Kathy was the expert on format, spelling, and grammar." Tony was comfortable with photo types and editing. We filed our Articles of Organization with the Connecticut Secretary of the State on April 1, 2014. We set up a private website in August 2014 and launched publicly in September 2014.

Even though Kathy Brown was a wife, mother of three, a Scout leader and, for the past several years, held a full-time teaching job, she put in an unbelievable amount of time and effort to make this paper a success. Many a morning she started her day at 5:30 a.m., posting articles. She was extremely dedicated and spent many hours nearly every day gathering, editing and posting content. And she did all this as a VOLUNTEER.

Kathy had a "nose for news" and was a stickler on proper editing and consistency of style. She knew or discovered many tricks of the trade. She was on the RSD17 School Board and had kids in the system. That gave her access to many stories



related to Education and Sports. She was the driving force behind the addition of Killingworth coverage. The site was a great success, despite some growing pains. Eventually spammers crashed it beyond repair; Kathy found an alternate website designer and we were quickly back in business.

Readers asked us to start a print version of the online paper. We found a publisher and presented a plan to join with them. They were skeptical that we could survive financially and generate enough content to support a weekly printed version using items selected from our website. We all pushed hard and joined with East Haddam News. The first edition of the printed Haddam News was published on November 17, 2016. It was distributed to every mailbox in both towns. Kathy worked even harder to establish reliable news sources and continue with her push for quality. The Town of Haddam chose us for their paper of record. That saved the town money and gave us an

Those feats, however, pale in comparison to his most impressive progress during his senior year. During the winter indoor track season, Law won the long jump in the Shoreline meet championship. environment for the H-K community, found ways to recognize the talents of all students, and energetically supported student education and activities. She was an empathetic volunteer who also worked outside the school to save and train deaf dogs and help others by taking her Therapy Dogs into the community.

Mrs. Bombaci passionately believed that all students must learn to "give back" to others and share their time, talents, and themselves—everyone is worthy of love and acceptance. This Award's purpose is to help ensure that the heart of "paying it forward" will continue to be present in our high school for many years.

This annual Award recognizes a member of the graduating class who has demonstrated significant and genuine dedication to voluntary service to Haddam-Killingworth High School and its community. An independent committee of select family and community members chooses the recipient. Kevin Cavrell demonstrated a high commitment to "always give back" and a strong leadership style of compassionate guidance in helping others realize success.

Principal Donna Hayward introduced Mrs. Bombaci at this year's ceremony and stood beside her in support. HVFC Responds: Two-Car Accident on Route 82 Connector

At 11:10 p.m. on June 18, Haddam Volunteer Fire Company was dispatched to the Route 82 Connector in Haddam for a reported two-car motor vehicle accident with entrapment.

A vehicle traveling eastbound on the Connector crossed over into the westbound lane and struck another vehicle head-on. The east-bound driver was able to self-extricate, was evaluated on scene, and was transported to Hartford Hospital via Haddam Ambulance.

The operator of the westbound vehicle reported that his leg was pinned under the dash. Firefighters used Hurst tools to remove the driver's side door before extricating the patient. The patient was transported to Yale Medical Center via East Haddam Ambulance.

Due to the severity of the accident and extensive debris on the roadway, all lanes of the 82 Connector were closed during the incident and traffic was rerouted back to Route 9. Crews applied absorbent materials to contain leaked fluids and worked to clean the scene for more than an hour after the incident.

This accident occurred in the same area as a fatal accident on May 6. This was the sixth MVA in Haddam so far this month. Connecticut State Police are investigating.

Notice to Haddam Taxpayers: Tax Bills Go Out on June 30

On May 18, the Board of Finance set the mill rate at 32.33 for the 2021 Grand List.

Tax bills will be mailed on June 30th. Payments will not be accepted before July 1st. If you misplaced it or did not get a copy of a bill they can be found under the tax page at Haddam.org. Payments must be made at the office or postmarked by the post office by August 1, 2022. There were many issues last year with the mail. Contact me if your payment is not posted within a week.

If you receive a bill for a vehicle or a business you do not own any longer, or if you do not get a bill and you think you should have, please call immediately. These bills will not go away if they are not addressed and could cause trouble down the road. The end of the month gets pretty busy; the sooner we can address an issue, the better.

Did you pay off your mortgage and not get a bill? Normally, if you are escrowed, they receive the bill and pay the taxes. If you paid off your mortgage, you should be receiving the bill. When properties sell close to the end of the fiscal year, the Tax Office may not always be aware of that change by the time the bills go out.

A pre-addressed envelope is included in the bills for easy payment. These payments go to a lockbox in Hartford and are processed through our bank. This makes the processing of payments much faster. Payments can also be dropped off or mailed to





the office at Town Office Building, Tax Office C/O Kristin Battistoni, 30 Field Park Drive, Haddam, CT 06438. Please make checks payable to the Town of Haddam. A drop box has been installed in the front of the building to the left of the front doors for night or weekend drops. This area is under surveillance for secure check only payments.

If you would like a mailed receipt, please include a self-addressed stamped envelope and mail to the Tax Office directly or use the outside drop box.

A credit card or a debit card can be used on our website or in the office. Payments cannot be taken over the phone. A service fee of 2.95% will be added to all payments made with a card. An Electronic Funds Transfer can be done on the website for \$1.50. The website does not update in real time. Online payments may not reflect for a few days, however, you will receive an email confirmation after the payment is made. Contact me if you have any questions about using the online system.

Partial payments are always accepted on accounts. This is the best way to help keep interest down if the bill cannot be paid in full.

The Tax Office will be closed to the public on Friday, June 30th to close the fiscal year and get ready for July. The Tax Office will have limited availability from August 8th to the 19th. Please address any concerns prior to this time

Green Hill Martial Arts to Offer 2022 Summer Programs

If you – or your offspring – hanker to work up a sweat and have fun learning a street savvy martial art this summer, but do not want to make a long-term commitment required by many studios, now's the time. Green Hill Martial Arts, a long-established school in the Olde Town Hall at Killingworth Congregational Church, offers special summer programs during July and August for kids, teens and adults.

Regular classes are open to summer-special students on a monthly basis for two months. Besides that, a class in basic martial arts skills will be taught Tuesday mornings. In addition to its extra summer offerings, Green Hill is accepting students for its highly successful Hapkido Hornets class, tailored for children ages 4 and 5 years. Through games, exercises and simplified drills, the little ones learn martial arts basics while having fun and enjoying interactions with their peers. Started only last year, the program already has graduated students into the school's youth classes for students ages 6 to 12 years.

The summer special accepts students in youth and adult classes at the regular monthly tuition rate of \$99, without the six-month contract normally required. People who enroll learn with regular students, although without credit for promotion in the ranked

color belt system. Adults, 13 years and up, train in Combat, or Chon-Tu Kwan, Hapkido, a modern, dynamic self-defense system that offers all the benefits of classical Martial Arts, but without rituals, rigidity, obsolete techniques and unsafe exercises. Hapkido, which began as a Korean art, focuses on joint locking and joint manipulation, low-line kicks, targeted striking, ground survival and weapon disarming techniques.

The Youth, or Chung So Nyun, Hapkido program focuses mainly on a simplified version of the adult program and also exposes children to some of our favorite techniques in other arts.

Many children are enrolled because they are bullied in school. In addition to teaching them how to defend themselves from physical harm, they learn how to defuse aggressive situations.

Combat Hapkido, used by military and police forces worldwide, is well suited for people of all ages and sizes because physical strength and great athletic abilities are not essential. On our mats you will see students from their teens to their eighties. "Hapkido" is a Korean word that means "The Way of Joined Energy," as the art uses an opponent's force to advantage.

As Americans, we can choose to confront our mistakes and rejoice when we correct them. As Americans, we can choose to address others with dignity and respect, rejoicing in reverence for human life through a life-and liberty-affirming paradigm underscored in "We The People" of our nation's founding document, the U.S. Constitution.

stride, Aidan then won the State Open with a personal best jump. Winning the Open qualified him to compete in the indoor New England Championship Meet in Boston. His progress continued in the Boston meet where he finished 2nd, missing 1st by an inch. According to HKHS track coach Dick Dupuis, that's the highest New England Championship finish in the history of the storied HK track program.

Law's progress continued in the spring of this year. He won 1st in the long jump in each regular season meet then at the Shoreline Championship meet he captured 1st in the long jump, 2nd in the 200 meter run, 3rd in the 100 meters, and 4th in the high jump. Aidan then proceeded to the state sectional meet where he finished 4th but jumped far enough to compete in the State Open Meet at Willowbrook Park. At Willowbrook Law found his best stride once again, doing a personal best of 22 feet, 5.5 inches. He finished 3rd in that meet, missing 2nd by about an inch. That jump qualified him to compete in Philadelphia last Saturday in the New

Balance National Rising Stars event. Despite injuring his back during his 3rd jump, Law still managed to finish 8th out of 28 East coast competitors. He was unable to finish his last 3 jumps due to the back injury.

When asked about the reason for his success, Aidan had this to say:

"I believe what led to my success over these past few track seasons is the amount of support I have received from my coaches and teammates. I would always be shooting for a high goal, and I would always hear back, "Oh, you can do that." Having encouraging teammates can really improve a person's strength, both mental and physical. Everybody together has helped along the way, and I would not be here with my accomplishments without every interaction. I also believe that the athletes from other schools pushed me to be better since I am a very competitive person."

Next year, Aidan plans to attend Keene State where he will certainly be a welcome addition to their track team.



HVFC Dispatched to Aid in Marine Rescue on Connecticut River

At 9:05 p.m. on June 19, Haddam Volunteer Fire Company was dispatched to aid in a marine rescue on the Connecticut River south of Haddam Meadows State Park. A woman who was canoeing without a life vest had reportedly tipped over and fallen into the river.

Marine units from Haddam, with mutual aid provided by East Haddam Volunteer Fire Department and Chester Hose Company, all accessed the river from different locations to search for the missing woman. The HVFC Chief, along with Connecticut State Police, accessed her launch point via a dirt road in the south end of the state park, where she and another person had built a campfire.

While the boats were deploying, the woman was able to swim to the shoreline where she repeatedly called out for help. Units from Haddam and East Haddam located the woman near the Mill Creek inlet and River Bluffs Road.

The woman was transferred to Haddam Meadows State Park where she was evaluated on scene by Haddam Ambulance personnel. She refused additional medical treatment.

Chester units located the missing canoe and transported it back to the state park. The camp fire was extinguished and all units were cleared.

According to the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) anyone using a manually-professed vessel must have a wearable life jacket aboard for each person. All children 12 and under must wear a life jacket.
