Girls Swim: HKHS Extends Winning Season to 4-0

The Haddam-Killingworth High School Girls Swim team extended its swim season record to 4-0 after defeating Ledyard 88-49 in an outdoor meet at Vitale Aquatic on October 7. The Cougar girls took first and third in the opening 200-yard medley relay and held the lead for the remainder of the meet. H-K Sophomore Liv Macaluso qualified for State Championships in the 100-yard backstroke, swimming 1:10.51. This was Macaluso's third State qualifying event this season, adding to her qualifying swims in the 100-yard butterfly (1:10.05) against Lyme-Old Lyme and the 200-yard I.M. (2:35.22) against Waterford. Senior co-captain Erin Marica again posted a State qualifying swim in the 500-yard freestyle (6:05.54). Twelve swimmers scored the winning points for HKHS: Aleysha Brawley (Senior), Emma Sajus (Junior), Erin Marica (Senior, Co-Captain), Johanna "Jo" Houska (Senior, Co-Captain), Kristen Thebeau (Senior, Captain), Layla Hayward (Junior), Maggie Miller (Freshman) Olivia Campo (Sophomore), Olivia "Liv" Macaluso (Sophomore), Peyton Tyler (Junior), Sofia Campo (Sophomore), and Veronica "VV" Pypa (Sophomore).

Motivational Speaker John Halligan Visits H-K Middle School

Motivational speaker John Halligan presented his story to the 6th, 7th and 8th grade students and staff at Haddam-Killingworth Middle School on September 27. Sponsored by the Nathaniel B. Field Memorial Foundation, John's program addressed bullying, mental health awareness, and suicide prevention. John lost his son Ryan to suicide on October 7, 2003. At the time of his death, Ryan was a 13 year old middle school student in Essex Junction, Vermont.

It was revealed in much greater detail after Ryan's death that he was ridiculed and humiliated by peers

at school and online. John's powerful and positive message emphasized the importance of achieving suicide prevention through self-advocacy and advocacy for others. John talked about being an upstander and not a bystander when someone is being bullied. Get involved, don't participate in bullying, and don't be afraid of apologizing if you owe one. Most importantly, John emphasized that "You are loved beyond belief!"

His presentation was truly a catalyst for change and it is our hope that students were inspired to make a difference. Individuals feeling depressed or bullied should turn to their family, friends, or trusted adults for help because You're Worth It.

For instance, I will not try to shrink the budget deficit by refusing to pass legislation to pay interest on the national debt. I will not try to protect the environment by limiting free trade. All of these principles can be ensured through the principled discipline and sacrifice needed to ensure the genuine grandeur of our country.

combined with her love of cross-country and the HK team, led her to choose a project that was close to her heart and melded these interests.

HK cross-country has an incredible record. This past year, the Boys team won their 11th overall state title, and the Girls team won their 5th state title. Yet the team's trail system was in great need of repair; washed-out areas had created huge ruts and were putting athletes at risk of injury.

Working closely with mentor, HKHS teacher and cross-country Coach Sean Gallagher, they were able to troubleshoot the issue. With a great work crew, lots of stone and hard work, they were able to create a long-term solution to the erosion issue in that area of the trail. Team Captain Izzy Berardino said "The quality of the trail has really improved. I remember my Sophomore year it was barely runnable, but since Ava's project, the team has been able to safely run the

front trail again."

Ava also constructed posts that were engraved and painted to mark the miles on the course. In addition, she recreated a map of the course that shows the route and mile markers. This will be used for the HKHS team and for visiting cross-country teams to help home meets run smoothly and safely.

Ava has been a member of Higganum Troop #60772 since kindergarten. Her experiences with the troop and the support she received helped lead her to taking on this enormous project. Ava shared her experience, stating, "This project taught me a lot about overcoming challenges, working with people, and the importance of perseverance. I had a lot of setbacks along the way, but I am glad I kept going and saw it through."

Ava is currently pursuing a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise science at the University of Vermont, with plans of becoming a physical therapist.
